Coláiste Éinde will be taking part in **Gaeilge24** this year. **Gaeilge24** is a challenge which encourages pupils to speak only in Irish exclusively for 24 hours: at home, in school and everywhere else. The challenge, which began in 2012, is organised by Conradh na Gaeilge. This year, more than 30,000 pupils from 300 schools across the country will be participating.

The challenge will take place on **Tuesday November 15th 2016**. We hope that you can assist your child/children with the challenge in any way possible on the day itself. And of course it's a great chance for you to use your own cúpla focal.

Every pupil will receive a sponsorship card and will be encouraged to raise €10 / £8.

Every pupil participating will also receive a support pack to help them on the day; including a t-shirt, a wrist band and a leaflet with useful phrases and ideas for the day. We hope that the challenge will help build students confidence in their oral Irish.
